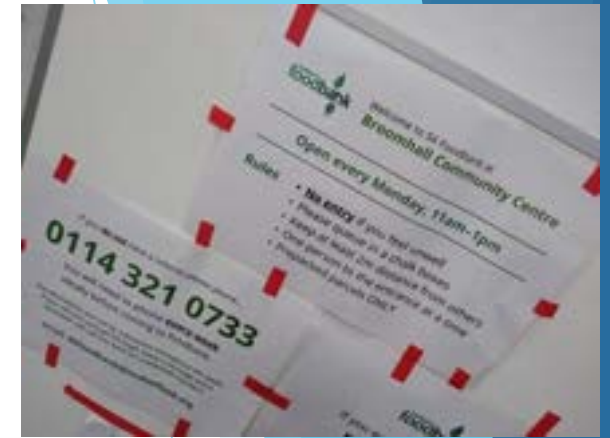
User groups

Foodbank

The Foodbank is on Mondays, 1030am – noon. It is one of eleven run by the S6 Foodbank (Network Church).

It provides 20 - 25 food and toiletry parcels a week (including vegetarian and Halal) as well as advice & support to help people out of their crisis.

People must be referred or phone in advance. Donations can be left at the Broomhall Centre.

YFL training runs sessions in local community centres to help people into employment:

1. Level 2 Certificate in Team Leadership
2. Level 2 Certificate in Infection Prevention and Control
3. Level 2 Certificate in Adult Social Care
4. SIA Door Supervisor Training (Optional)

Step 1: For Registration, please e-mail at register@yfltraining.co.uk with the following information:

- Proof of ID (Photo of Passport / Driving License / Birth Certificate)
- Proof of Address in letter with your address dated in the last 3 months
- Proof of National Insurance Number (NI) or Social Security / No letter (only apply)

Step 2: You will be required to complete a Basic Maths and English Assessment (BASIC) via an online link sent by YFL Training.

Level 2 Certificate in Team Leadership* (3 weeks) → **Level 2 Certificate in Principles of the Prevention and Control of Infection in Health-Care Settings* (2 weeks)** → **Level 2 Certificate in Health & Social-Care* (2 weeks)** → **Level 2 Certificate in Emergency First Aid Knowledge* (4 hours online)**

*All training will be mainly workbook based, taught online with plenty of additional support. You will be required to attend once or twice a week to meet your tutor as per the training requirements.

All training material and support will be provided to all learners completely free of charge. Online training will be via YouTube lectures and support will be provided via WhatsApp / Call / Texts.

Please note: Full Time / Part time students are not eligible for this training.
